Each evening is complemented by **historical films about Frankfurt** and **live music featuring artists from diverse cultural traditions**. This creates special evenings that bring together film, music and community.

Everyone is welcome. Entry is free.

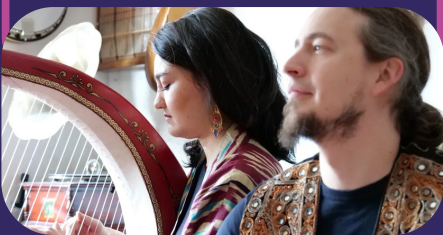
